

GUSD Board of Education Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible to participate in extracurricular and co-curricular activities, students in grades 7-12 must demonstrate satisfactory educational progress in the <u>previous</u> grading period, including, but not limited to: (Education Code <u>35160.5</u>)

1. Maintenance of a minimum of 2.0 grade point average with no Fs on a 4.0 scale

Ineligible students may be granted a probationary period of no more than one quarter in their GUSD High School career. A panel comprised of site administration, the athletic director and a teacher will review individual cases and grant probation to only those students faced with an extreme hardship or extraordinary circumstances. Students considered must possess a 2.0 GPA with only one F. Students granted probationary eligibility must meet the required standards by the end of the probationary period in order to remain eligible for participation.

- a. The probationary period will not be granted to students who are ineligible under the "Classroom Citizenship" policy.
- 2. Maintenance of minimum progress toward meeting high school graduation requirements
- 3. Classroom Citizenship

Students will receive a citizenship grade every quarter from each of their classroom teachers.

The grade of "Outstanding," "Satisfactory," or "Needs Improvement" will be based on the "Citizenship Guidelines." The citizenship grade for each class will be shown on the student's report card, but not on the transcript or permanent records.
